Coach Mullens' 200th Win

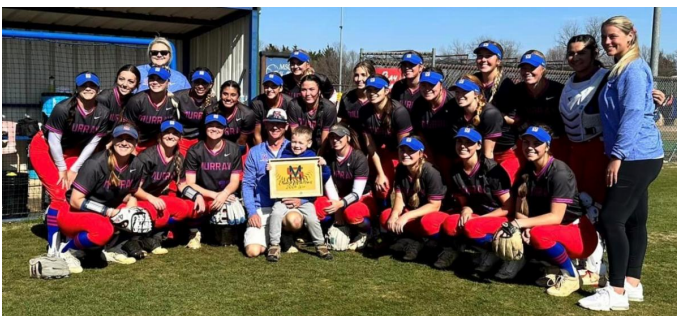
Murray State softball opened up their 2023 season Sunday afternoon in a double header against Garden City at home.
